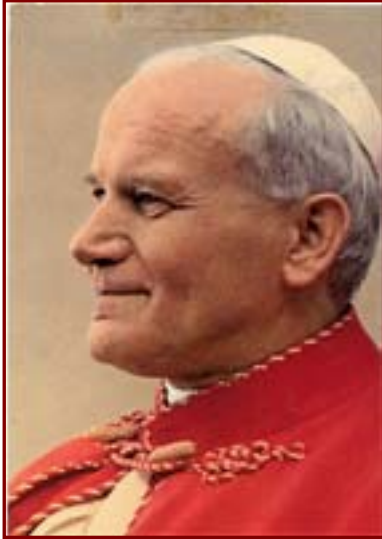

years ago, the couple starred together in "The Marrying Man."



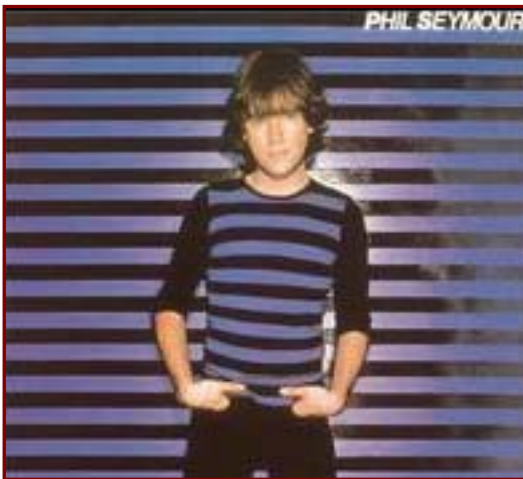
